Trash and Recycling Services

New contracts have been awarded for trash and recycling collection and disposal which take effect March 2nd.

Trash Collection

Beginning March 2nd, Borough residents will no longer be required to use the Orange Trash Bags. Residents may use regular brand-name trash bags and place them curbside for collection. The first weekly collection day of the new service will be **MONDAY** March 2nd and every **MONDAY** thereafter. Until that date residents must continue to purchase and use the Orange trash bags and place them curbside for Friday pick-up. Between March 1st and June 1st the Borough will refund unopened 5-packs of Orange Trash Bags. Exchanges of 5-packs for refund will occur **ONLY** at the Borough Hall. Please do not return them to the retail purchase site. No refunds will be given for opened 5-packs, so use them up before March.

Recycling Collection

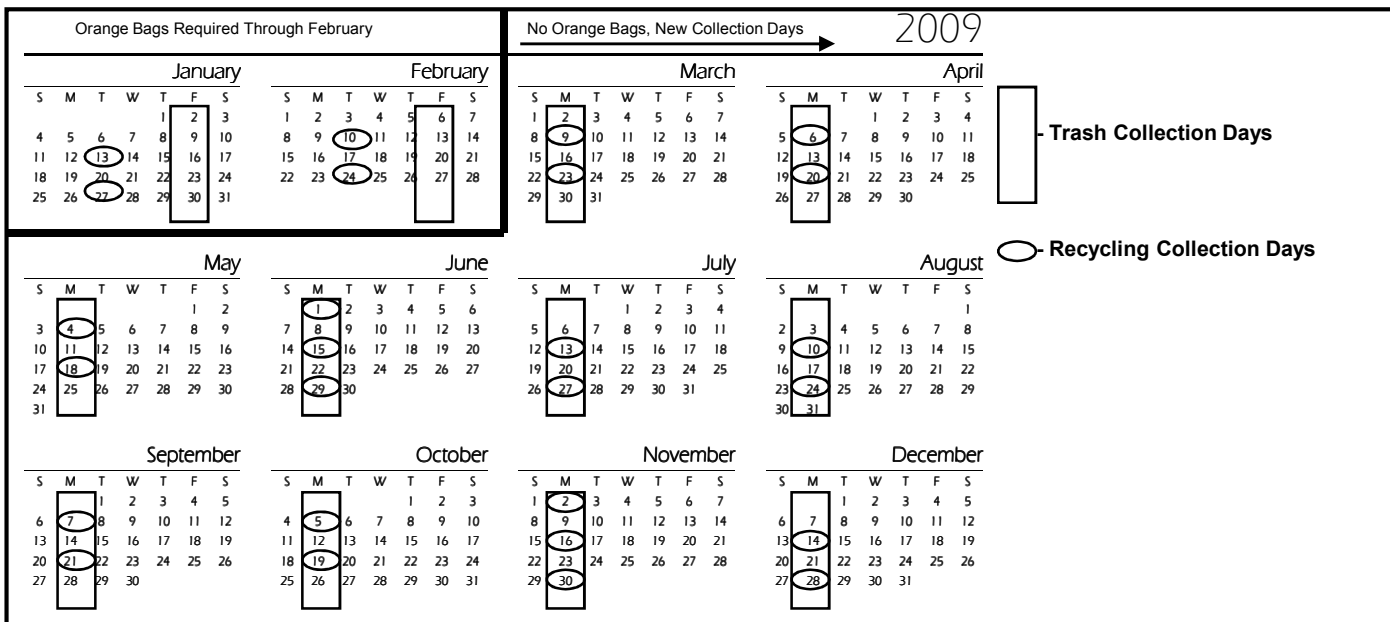
Recycling collection will occur every other **MONDAY** beginning March 9th. Until that date recyclables will continue to be collected every other **Friday**.

Recyclebank Rewards Program

All household residents who currently use curbside recycling collection will be issued a specific recycling container for use with the Recyclebank program. The container will hold all recyclable glass and plastic bottles and metal cans plus recyclable paper including newspaper, magazines and discarded mail. Oversized items like large cardboard can be placed next to the container curbside.

Most Recyclebank containers will be 96 gallon but smaller containers (65 and 35 gallon) are available to residents who request them. Please use the enclosed request form if you require a container smaller than 96 gallons.

Recyclebank incentivizes recycling by providing rewards points for every pound of recyclables collected. Participants will be able to redeem rewards points for retail discounts at hundreds of local and national retail businesses including ACME, Shop-rite, Target.com, Home Depot and many others. You will receive introductory information by mail from Recyclebank in the coming weeks.



What to Place in Your Curbside Recycling Container

- Clear, brown and green glass, food, drink and other glass containers;
- Newspaper, magazine and other paper (clean) including junk mail;
- Aluminum cans, containers, and other aluminum items;
- Tin cans;
- Plastic containers used for milk, water, soda, laundry detergent, fabric softener, dish detergent and bleach;
- Cardboard and computer paper

Disposal Of Unused Medications

DO NOT DISPOSE of prescriptions and over the counter medications down the drain or toilet. Waste-water treatment facilities cannot remove harmful pharmaceutical compounds and these may end up in your drinking water.

3 STEPS FOR PROPER DISPOSAL

1. Keep medicine in original container and mark out personal information.
2. Dilute pills with water and add coffee grounds, cat litter or dirt. Place diluted pills in trash (do not recycle the pill container).
3. Pour liquid medication directly in trash bag (recycle bottle if possible).

How To Recycle Electronics Waste

Electronics such as TVs, VCRs, Stereos, Computer Monitors, CPU Towers, Printers, Scanners, Speakers, DVD Players or similar devices are **NOT** to be disposed with regular trash. Call the Borough for oversized items such as console TVs. Smaller items should be taken to the convenience center at the SCUA landfill in Alloway on McKillip Rd at Rt. 540. There is a charge of 4 cents per pound to cover the cost of processing these items for proper recycling and disposal.

Recyclebank Containers

Woodstown Borough is proceeding with implementation of a recycling incentives contract with Recyclebank. As part of this program you will receive a special container for recyclables. The default container size for households will be 96 gallons. However if you are in a situation where you feel you cannot accommodate this large container, a smaller one can be ordered if you notify the Borough in advance. Remember that you still will be storing recyclables for 2 weeks at a time so choose the largest container that you can accommodate. One container per household. Dimensions of containers are as follows:

96 gallon – Approximate Dimensions: Width 26 inches, Depth 34.5 inches, Height 45 inches

If you desire this size container you do not need to notify the Borough.

64 gallon – Approximate Dimensions: Width 24 inches, Depth 27 inches, Height 41.5 inches

35 gallon – Approximate Dimensions: Width 19 inches, Depth 24 inches, Height 37.5 inches
