

2026 PROPOSED WATER & SEWER RATES

WATER RATES

<u>Water Rates</u>	<u>Yearly Rate</u>	<u>Quarterly Bill (10,000 gallons)</u>
40,000 gallons/year 10,000 gallons/quarter	\$488.75	\$122.19

For the average single-family household using 10,000 gallons of water per quarter, the water bill will increase \$15.94 per quarter. Actual costs may vary depending on individual water usage. Excess rates apply beginning at 10,001 gallons per quarter.

WATER EXCESS RATES

<u>Water Excess Rates</u>	<u>Calculated after April 1, 2026</u>
10,001 gallons per quarter	\$7.30 per 1,000 gallons
25,001 gallons per quarter	\$7.82 per 1,000 gallons

Excess usage charges will be billed quarterly and will be due the following quarter. For calendar year 2026, the excess usage incurred during 2025 will also be allocated into four (4) equal quarterly installments.

SEWER RATES

<u>Sewer Rates</u>	<u>Flat Rate</u>	<u>Yearly Rate Flat Rate + 50% water bill</u>	<u>Quarterly Bill</u>
Per unit	\$488.75	\$488.75+\$244.38 = \$733.13	\$183.28 + 50% any the excess

Residential sewer fees consist of a flat annual rate plus 50% of the annual water rate. The flat rate has increased from \$638.00 to \$733.13 per year. This annual flat rate is divided into four quarterly installments of \$183.28, representing a quarterly increase of \$23.78. In addition, if any unit has excess water charges, 50% of the excess charge shall be added to the quarterly bill.

Example:

Water Rate using 10,000 gallon/quarter = \$122.19 quarterly
 Sewer Rate = \$183.28 quarterly + 50% of water excess amount

Water and Sewer bills will be issued quarterly and are due on 2/1, 5/1, 8/1 and 11/1.

These rate adjustments are necessary to address the increasing costs associated with providing a safe and reliable water supply and wastewater treatment services. The cost of treated water and system operations has risen, and these adjustments are required to maintain the Authority's infrastructure, meet operational expenses, and maintain a balanced budget while continuing to provide high-quality service.

Members of the public are invited to attend the Public Hearing and provide comments regarding the proposed water and sewer rate adjustments. All comments will become part of the official record of the hearing.
